### The NHS Health Check Programme

- The NHS Health Check programme is the national cardiovascular risk screening programme that helps prevent diabetes, heart disease, kidney disease, stroke and dementia. Eligible patients aged 40 74 are invited by their GP practice to have a check once every five years.
- CVD places a considerable strain on the NHS and wider society, accounting for an estimated £8.96 billion a year in NHS healthcare costs alone.
- An estimated 50% to 80% of CVD cases are caused by modifiable and preventable risk factors, including: smoking, obesity, hypertension, high cholesterol, harmful drinking, poor diet and physical inactivity.
- These risk factors are greater in lower socioeconomic groups, making CVD one of the conditions most strongly associated with health inequalities.
- In Norfolk, the programme identifies high risk CVD factors in individuals and has pathways to refer them into lifestyle services such as smoking cessation, weight management, support with alcohol and substance misuse and diabetes prevention.







### The NHS Health Check Programme

- NHS Health Check has the potential to annually.....
- Prevent 1600 heart attacks and strokes
- Prevent 4000 people developing diabetes
- Detect 20,000 cases of diabetes or kidney disease
- Avoid at least 650 premature deaths
- In Norfolk, NHS Health Check has the potential to annually....
- Prevent 27 heart attacks and strokes
- Prevent 68 people developing diabetes
- Detect 340 cases of diabetes or kidney disease
- Avoid at least 11 premature deaths





#### **Health Checks in Norfolk**



- In primary care, most practices continue to deliver NHS Health Checks in -house, and a small number of pharmacies\* continue to offer opportunistic health checks.
- REED Wellbeing\* aim to deliver NHS Health Checks to patients who were due their health check during the pandemic (2020/21/22) as well as providing NHS HCs for any eligible patient. Patients can book using REED's online / telephone system. Opportunistic or walk-in health checks are also provided at outreach events or where a patient requests one. REED are Norfolk-wide, and community-based. This service is commissioned until September 30th 2024.

\*Please note that REED & pharmacies do not have access to GP patient data.

#### **Health Checks in Norfolk, cont...**



- The outcomes of those patients who have an NHS Health Check with REED or pharmacies are securely sent to their GP practice via secure email PDF (REED) or PharmOutcomes (pharmacies).
- NHS HCs are also reviewed by CQC when they inspect. As part of the 'Effective' domain, CQC look at:
  - whether appropriate NHS HCs for patients aged 40 to 74 have been undertaken
  - whether there is appropriate and timely follow-up on the outcome of NHS HCs where abnormalities or risk factors were identified.







#### **Eligible Population Calculation**



- The <u>estimated</u> 5-year eligible population per GP Practice is calculated as: the practice's registered population 40-74 minus the estimated ineligible population.
- The ineligible population (i.e. the number of people aged 40-74 already on a disease register) is estimated by age band and sex using the following percentages from the "NHS Health Checks Best Practice Guidance"
- Also, as per the best practice guidance:

"The eligible population is independent from the number of invitations already made during the five-year cycle. When estimating the total eligible population, an individual who has received an NHS Health Check in the last five years – although not eligible for re-call until five years after their first NHS Health Check – remains in the total eligible population."





## NHS Health Check Eligible Population Calculation Cont



- If your practice would like to provide NCC with your eligible population, please email (phcontracts@norfolkgov.uk) the data below and this will be incorporated in NCC's reporting:
- All the practice's registered population 40-74
- Number of people 40-74 already on a chronic disease register
- Norfolk County Council will then calculate the NHS Health Check 5-year eligible population for each practice as "All the practice's registered population 40-74 minus the number of people aged 40-74 already on a disease register".
- Please note that the practice's 5-year eligible population doesn't exclude people that already had an NHS Health Check.





# **Eligibility Criteria**



NHS Health Checks are for people who are aged 40 to 74 who do NOT have any of the following pre-existing conditions:

- heart disease
- chronic kidney disease
- diabetes
- high blood pressure (hypertension)
- atrial fibrillation
- transient ischaemic attack
- inherited high cholesterol (familial hypercholesterolemia)
- heart failure
- peripheral arterial disease
- stroke
- currently being prescribed statins to lower cholesterol







## **Eligibility Criteria**



#### Also excluded are people who:

- previous NHS Health Checks have found that the patient had a 20% or higher risk of getting cardiovascular disease over the next 10 years.
- patients who have learning disabilities -(<u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/learning-disabilities/annual-health-checks/</u>).
- patients who have had a health check in the last 5 years.







#### **Practice Searches**



#### For practices to invite eligible patients to:

- apply the overall NHS Health Check Eligibility Criteria.
- > search for patients that had their last NHS HC over 5 years.
- Send patient the NCC templated letter that directs patients to book with their GP practice or with REED.

#### **Contract Information**



Those practices contracted with Norfolk County Council for NHS Health Checks will be reimbursed for:

- Lot 1a (GP only) sending out letter / text invites = £2.10 per letter / text (does not apply to any reminder letters)
- Lot 1b delivery of NHS HCs by the practice = £30.00 per HC using phlebotomy or £33.00 using POCT / NPT
- Lot 1c (GP only) community records update = £2.00

#### **Payment:**

NCC GP claims portal: Claims for NHS health checks, sexual health services and stop smoking services - Norfolk County Council

When a payment is due, Norfolk County Council will extract and verify the activity on. or soon after. the 10th of quarter as follows:

- Q1 20th July
- Q2 20th October
- Q3 20th January
- Q4 20th April

Please note that if a practice's patient has an NHS HC delivered by a community Provider, the practice <u>cannot</u> claim delivery payments for this patient and should not be included in the data entered in the portal. The practice <u>can</u> claim community records update payments in this scenario.

Pharmacies will be paid by NCC by activity from PharmOutcomes.







#### **Increasing Uptake Key Points**



NHS

- Conduct a regular data extract of eligible patients on a monthly basis and send out a letter invite to the identified cohort (10% recommended each month).
- Consider prioritising initial mail outs to patients at higher risk of CVD, e.g. smokers, those living in IMDs 1 & 2, those that are obese and ethnic minorities particularly those of Asian ethnicity.
- Advertise NHS Health Checks using the official materials on the NHS
  Health Check website or NCC HILs website (see next slide). Your
  practice could put up posters, include a section on your website and
  patient updates, have leaflets available and use electronic screens to
  advertise.
- Utilise REED Wellbeing if your practice cannot deliver all health checks

   there are templated letters you can use to invite your patients to have a health check with them.
- Consider conducting follow-up text messages to your patients who have had a letter inviting them for an NHSHC, encouraging them to book.

#### **Training for Practitioners**



For Practitioners to deliver the NHS HC, they must hold the core competencies (as per the National Framework). NHS HC training is strongly recommended to build upon the core competencies, as follows:

- Practitioners can see, and book, available training, via: Norfolk | Smart Health Solutions full day
   NHS HC training is recommended once every 3 years.
- Practitioners can complete the NHS HC online courses within the National Learning Hub, via: NHS
   Health Check Training
- Practitioners can complete the NHS HC training video on the E-lfh, via: NHSE elfh Hub (e-lfh.org.uk)
- Practitioners <u>must</u> be clinically competent in the core competencies of the NHS HC, viewable via the Competency Framework: <u>NHS Health Check - Training</u>








#### NHS Health Check Ardens Lifestyle Support Patient Info
